Terms & Conditions of Membership

- Membership is conditional upon satisfactory attendance and timely annual renewal. Membership may be terminated at the sole discretion of the committee.
- Members will notify the committee of any change to their recorded personal details or FAC conditions within 30 days.
- Membership ends March 31st after which date all membership rights and range access cease. A period of grace until April 30th may be allowed to renew without forfeiture of membership at the discretion of the Committee. This period does not extend membership in any way. A member failing to renew by April 30th is deemed to have resigned from the Association. Former members wishing to re-join after April 30th should submit a new application for approval by the Committee.
- Members will observe all local range regulations concerning permitted ammunition type, muzzle energy and the ballistic performance of commercial and hand-loaded ammunition. The decision of the Range Conducting Officer (RCO) is final in all matters relating to range safety and security. Disputes must be directed to the Committee, and not to the RCO or to any third party.
- Members will carry a valid membership card and, where appropriate, a Shooter Certification Card, at all times while on the range. Those who fail to comply may be refused entry. Replacements for lost membership cards are available at a cost of £5.
- No photographic or video recording equipment may be used at any Association meeting without prior permission from a Committee member. No person may be photographed or recorded in any format while on Association business without their express permission. Photographic, audio or video material relating to any Association activity may not be discussed on any social media site, uploaded to the internet or sent to any media organisation without the prior written consent of the Committee Chairman.
- Members shooting on Ministry of Defence (Landmarc) ranges must hold a National Rifle Association Shooter Certification Card (SCC) issued by a Home Office Approved club. Members requiring an SCC from the VAA should contact a range secretary. All cards issued by the VAA must be returned on cessation of membership, or on request by the Committee.
- Guests are permitted only if they are members of a Home Office Approved club, or hold a personal Firearm Certificate, or are attending an official Association Guest Day as published on the Association website and in the VAA newsletter.

Data Privacy

The Vintage Arms Association (VAA) is both controller and processor of its members data, and may use the information provided during application and in any other communication in all matters as stated under the VAA Data Privacy Notice. The VAA reserve the right to change the Data Privacy Notice at any time, and will notify members of any substantial updates. Members are advised to read this document, and any other privacy notice that may be provided when collecting or processing personal data in order to be aware of how this information will be used.
